THE « V » CAMPAIGN

This propaganda campaign was initiated by the Belgian Underground movements around the time of the national holiday of July 21, 1941. Hundreds of leaflets, stickers and papillons were produced and the “V” for victory, introduced by Churchill, was all over Belgium. The campaign ended when the Germans adopted the same symbol for their own propaganda. What follows is a small collection representative of what was produced.

Drawing showing a map of Belgium, France and England with a German soldier, his head stuck in the Channel and his legs forming a “V”. On the reverse this text *A reproduire et à distribuer autant que possible. La lettre V qui figure sur les calicots pendus par ordre des Allemands...veulent dire que le peuple allemand sera toujours Violateur, Voleur, Vampire, Vaincu* (and the Flemish translation). 275 x 215.

L'Éloquence des "V". Mimeographed in blue. 1 p. 8vo. On white paper.
Anti-German poem of 31 lines each ending in a « v » (pronounced « vé »). 210 x 135.

V-RAF. On both sides of a square 16mo. Mimeographed papillon. 100 x 100

BL 0005

Caricature showing Hitler doing a handstand on Belgium with his legs forming a "V". Sticker. 85 x 70.

Les boches tentent de s'emparer du signe V dont la profusion sur nos murs risque de miner le moral de leurs troupes... 1 p. 12mo oblong. Carbon copy on paper. In the margin, many small « v »s making a large « V ». 95 x 170.

Notre « V » & leur « V ». Lettre ouverte à Messieurs nos Protecteurs. Ainsi donc, voilà du nouveau, vous vous mêlez de faire de l'esprit à présent... 1 1/3 p. large 4to. Typewritten. Very amusing yet aggressive against the use of the « V » by the Germans. 295 x 210.

A Monsieur Von Renard que les nombreux V ont l'air d'empêcher e dormir comme l'œil qui poursuivait Cain jusque dans la tombe. 1 p. square 16mo. Printed. 135 x 115.

BL 0010

La Mer attend les Boches, air de « Viens au bal de l'amour » et Ve, Ve, air de « Boum » de Charles Trenet. 1 p. large 4to. Mimeographed. Lyrics to two songs, the second one inspired by the « V ». With the fictitious address *Imprimatur: Ober-Feld-Kommandatu . Mons.* 295 x 210.

Bonsoir et Courage. On les aura les Boches. Postcard with the national colours of Belgium with a large « V » and in a circle *Ici Londres*. A view of the British Parliament. On the reverse **Vendu au profit des orphelins du Groupe Général de Sabotage de Belgique « G ».** 145 x 95. See also BL 0012 for the Flemish version.

BL 0012

En Zonder er op te Boffen, Toch zullen wij ze hebben de Moffen. Identical postcard to BL 0011 but with the text in Flemish. On the reverse, **Verkocht ten voordeele der weezen van de Belgische Algemeene vernielingsgroep « G ».** 145 x 95.

BL 0013

Rira bien qui rira le dernier. Winston Churchill 1940. Postcard showing Churchill's face surrounded by a large « V ». 140 x 90

BL 0014

Postcard with a large « V » in the national colours of Belgium accompanied by a Croix de Lorraine, the R.A.F. symbol and the Belgium coat-of-arms. It is stencil-coloured. This card was probably privately done and not mass-produced. 115 x 75

BL 0015

Soldats allemands, voici votre sort. Deutsche Soldaten, dass ist ihr schicksal. Drawing showing a skull wearing a German soldier's helmet surrounded by a large « V » and the word **Russie**. Sticker on pink paper. Same presentation as BL 0016. 145 x 70. Also similar to BL 0048.

BL 0016

Hitler vous avait promis la Paix, il a tenu parole. Hitler hat ihr der Friede Versprochen. Er hat wort gehalten. Same presentation as BL 0015 with the large "V" and the word **Russie**. Sticker on white paper. Two filing holes. 145 x 75. Also similar to BL 0048.

BL 0017

Vlamingen Vooruit. Sticker. One corner cut and an important tear but without loss of text. 60 x 75.

BL 0018

RAF / V. Sticker/ papillon in red letters on green onion skin cut in the shape of a « V ». Certainly made by hand. 95 x 95.

BL 0019

V with a star above the « V » smashing a swastika. Blue border. Sticker. 80 x 60.

BL 0020

V. Large « V » in blue. The letters R.A.F. were added in blue pencil by hand. A hole and a tear. Sticker. 90 x 105.

BL 0021

Le V de la victoire boche. V le notre est plus petit mais combien plus certain. Printed sticker. 55 x 75.

BL 0022

V. R.A.F. c'est du pain et la liberté. In red letters. Papillon. 70 x 45.

11 November 1942. Anniversaire de notre libération. Concitoyens !.. Small leaflet 1 p. 16mo. Folded. Published by the Front de l'Indépendance. List of instructions to be observed on that day. 100 x 80.

BL 0024

À la population Liégeoise ! Par un nouveau coup de force le Grand-Liège est réalisé ! Manoeuvre politique destinée à livrer Liège et sa contrée industrielle aux prostitués nazis et aux rexistes.... 2 pp. 8vo. No date. Published by the Fédération Liégeoise de la Centrale Wallonne du Parti Socialiste Belge. 210 x 140.

BL 0025

Alerte aux glaneurs. No date. Orange paper. Protests the fact that the Germans prohibit the agricultural practice of gleaning. Published by the Fédération Liégeoise du Parti Communiste. 100 x 140.

BL 0026

Alerte. Belges ! Léon Degrelle vient de donner à ses mercenaires.... 1 p. 8vo. Two filing holes. Leaflet calling for a demonstration against the Rexists at Easter on April 12-13-14 [1941]. A note in pencil reads "April 1941". 190 x 135.

BL 0027

Aux Patriotes Belges. 4 pp. 4to. Leaflet printed on coated paper of good quality and issued by the Parti Belge. Gives the projects and the political orientation which should Belgium should follow after the Liberation. Probably dates from 1944. 255 x 200

BL 0028

Avis à la population ! Les réquisitions d'argent, vivres, etc... Leaflet-papillon 1 p. 16mo With two bands in the national colours. Published by the Partisans du Borinage. Announces that their partisans are not responsible for the requisitions done after June 26, 1944. On laid cream paper. 105 x 95.

BL 0029

Avis à la population. L'armée blanche communique:... 1 p. 16mo. Green paper. Leaflet published by the Organisation de Résistance nationale and ordering the most absolute discretion when it comes to the doings and names of persons involved with the Résistance. 135 x 110.

BL 0030

Belges ! La guerre est entrée dans une phase nouvelle. 2 pp. 8vo. Leaflet of the Comité Central du Parti Communiste de Belgique. n.d. [late 1943] but after the liberation of Corsica and Yugoslavia. Strong appeal for resistance. 220 x 135.

BL 0031

Belgique loyale ou Belgique félonne ? 2 pp. small folio on two columns. Protesting the publication of a leaflet which appears underground called *Belgique loyale* and signed by veterans of the two wars. The leaflet under scrutiny is fascist and monarchist and proposes a deal with the enemy. On the reverse, a reproduction of an article taken from issue no.8 of the underground newspaper *L'Espoir*. Interesting text on the role of the king. The leaflet was probably issued in 1941 since issue no.12 of that newspaper was printed in December 1941. Marginal tears and yellowed paper. 310 x 210.

Comment organiser le Front de l'Indépendance. 1 p. 8vo. Goals and instructions from the Front de l'Indépendance. No date. 220 x 140.

BL 0033

Deutsche Soldaten !! Merkt Euch wohl dass jeder Belgier in Militar-Uniform.... Leaflet-papillon in German. 1 p. 24mo. In translation it reads: *Please notice that any Belgian in uniform, in Belgium, is illegally replacing a German soldier, in order that most of you will be sent to the Russian front where certain death awaits you.* According to the *Livre d'or de la Résistance belge* (p. 138), which has a French translation, 100.000 gummed labels were printed in 1941-42 with this text and pasted everywhere German soldiers were located. 70 x 90.

Front de l'Indépendance du Borinage. Réquisitionnés aux voix ferrées, Espionnez le trafic ferroviaire ! 1 p. 8vo. n.d. The Germans having decided to place civilians to watch the railroads, this leaflet asks these watchmen to sabotage the material and to give information to the Resistance on the railway traffic. 200 x 150.

BL 0036

Jeunes bruxellois ! Le 21 Juillet, unissez-vous dans la lutte pour l'indépendance du Pays ! Leaflet by the Fédération des Jeunes Gardes Socialistes de Bruxelles. 2 pp. 16mo. July 21st is the national holiday of Belgium. This leaflet of communist origin happily reports heavy German losses

on the Russian front in the last 15 days and gives instructions for demonstrations and strikes. It demands the liberation of certain political prisoners (gives names). Worn but very legible. 135 x 110.

1914-1941. La situation vue en Belgique. De Toestand gezien van uit Belgie. 1 p. 8vo oblong. Drawing of a German helmet of 1914 and of another from 1941 receiving a punch from the R.A.F. 180 x 90.

BL 0038

L'Internationale. Mimeographed leaflet. 1 p. folio. Leaflet of the Communist Party Contains 5 verses and a refrain in French. The heading reads *Vendu deux francs au profit du Soutien du Parti Communiste.* Worn. 330 x 215.

BL 0039

La lutte contre le banditisme. 2 pp. 8vo. Issued by the Bureau national du Front de l'Indépendance. Protest against highway robbers who attack the population and are confused with Resistance fighters who only attack the Nazis and traitors. One marginal tear. 215 x 150.

BL 0040

La Patrie appelle ses fils au combat. Soulèvement national. Leaflet 1 p. 12mo oblong. Leaflet calling the Belgian patriots to a national uprising and inviting them to join the Front de l'Indépendance and the Milices Patriotiques. Leaflet signed by the Front de l'Indépendance (sic) carolorégien. N.d. [circa 1944]. 110 x 140 .

BL 0041

Lettre ouverte au Général Von Falkenhausen. Leaflet dated August 10, 1941 and signed La Belgique enchaînée. 2 pp. 8vo. Threatening letter to the German Commander-in-chief for Belgium and Northern France. Worn with a few holes and the loss of a few letters. 210 x 155.

BL 0042

Ville de Liège. Liégeois, aidez les malheureuses victimes du bombardement d'Anvers. Issued by the Collège des Bourgmestres et Échevins du Grand-Liège. n.d. (dated in pencil 13-4-43). Possibly official and not underground. 130 x 170.

BL 0043

Monsieur, tous les Belges célébreront le 11 November.. n.d.(1944). 1 p. 8vo. On onion skin. Leaflet issued by the Front de l'Indépendance. Call for celebration as victory day approaches and wishing that the occupants get expelled from the country. 215 x 140.

BL 0044

Parti Socialiste Belge. Comité d'Action des Étudiants Socialistes de Belgique. Leaflet dated Bruxelles March 1943. 2 pp. 8vo. Instructions to students on how to avoid the Service du Travail Obligatoire (STO). 210 x 145.

BL 0045

Pas un gramme de métal pour l'ennemi. Pas un sou pour sa guerre. Pas de complicité des administrations belges. 2 pp. square 8vo. Protests the ordinance of October 20th asking the head of families to deliver non ferrous metals to the Germans. The leaflet asks the population to ignore the ordinance and suggests ways to do so. Probably issued late in 1942. Worn. 175 x 135.

BL 0046

Patriotes. Leaflet crudely printed. 1 p. large 8vo. Mentions the invasion of Belgium « three years ago », which would date the printing to 1943. Call for demonstrations on May 10th. 215 x 110.

BL 0047

Programme du Front de l'Indépendance. 1 p. 8vo. no date. Details the goals and aspirations of the F.I. 220 x 140.

BL 0048

Russie tombeau de l'armée allemande. Sticker showing an enormous swastika covered with snow in the middle of a snowy cemetery. See also two similar stickers under the « V » Campaign section (BL 0015 and BL 0016). 140 x 70.

BL 0049

Solidarité dans le combat ! Pour chasser l'occupant il faut unir toutes les forces saines de la ville et de la campagne. 4 pp. 8vo. Leaflet from the Belgian Communist Party. n.d. (circa1942). Appeals to the workers to stop producing for the Nazis and to the farmers not to deliver their products to the Nazi Corporation. 220 x 140.

BL 0050

Texte de la Proclamation qui a affiché à Bruxelles sur l'ordre du Bourgmestre et arrachée par les ennemis en rage.. Mimeographed text on good quality paper reproducing the Proclamation of Dr. F.J. Van de Meulebroeck, burgomaster of Brussels, dated June 30, 1941. 1 p. 4to. 275 x 200.

BL 0051

Un couple de salopards. With heading *Supplément à La Voix des Luxembourgeois*. 1 p. 8vo. n.d. [circa 1943-44]. Leaflet published by the Mouvement National Belge in Arlon which also published the underground paper *La Voix des Luxembourgeois*, affiliated to *La Voix des Belges*. Photographs and detailed descriptions of Prosper-Valère De Zitter, who was often posing as a Canadian, and Maria-Louisa Giralt, two agents of the Gestapo. 220 x 135.

BL 0052

Vive le Socialisme. Leaflet of the Belgian Socialist Party. 2 pp. small 4to. n.d. but immediately after the German attack against the USSR (June 1941). Although sympathizing with the fight of the Soviet people, the text is very critical of the role played by Russia in 1939 and also of the behaviour of the Belgian Communists. The Socialist Party supports the U.S.S.R. but wants to remain independent of Stalin. 205 x 155.

BL 0053

Sabotez. Sticker. Drawing showing a man breaking a swastika on an anvil with a sledgehammer. 85 x 55.

BL 0054

Samedi 10 Mai. Anniversaire de deuil. Belges ! n'achetez pas de journaux. 2 pp. 12mo. Probably issued on May 10, 1941 on the first anniversary of the German invasion. 135 x 110.

BL 0055

Les armées de l'air américaines adressent ce message au peuple belge. 1 p. 8vo. It is the text of the American airdropped leaflet, with code USB19, which was dropped on May 10-11, 1944. It was copied with some modifications by the Belgian Resistance. An interesting example of

transmission of Allied propaganda through the Underground. 210 x 140.

BL 0056

Le Roi - La Loi - La Liberté. 1 p. 8vo oblong. The slogan is surrounded by the national colours. Probably printed for the national holiday of July 21, 1942. 130 x 260.

BL 0057

Noirs, prenez-garde ! Prenez-garde ! L'armée blanche vous regarde. Papillon printed by the Front de l'Indépendance. 1 p. 8vo. The *noirs* were the collaborators. Stamp of the private collection C. Piérard in Mons. 65 x 85

BL 0058

Pourchassons, abattons les tortionnaires rexistes ! 1 p. 8vo. Leaflet of the Fédération boraine du Parti Communiste. Protests against the Rexists serving the Gestapo who assassinated Dr. Biesman and MM. Gérain and Hysman. The second part of the leaflet is made up of the words to the song entitled *Les Trois Mousquetaires* directed against MM. Scouflaire, Destrain and Chèron. 210 x 145.

BL 0059

11 November 1943: xxve anniversaire de la libération de la Belgique. Suivez les consignes du Front de l'Indépendance. Chômez ! Manifestez ! Sabotez ! and on the reverse *Que veut le Front de l'Indépendance*. 2 pp. 8vo. Folded. 215 x 155.

BL 0060

Magistrats, avocats, notaires, médecins, industriels, ingénieurs, employés, ouvriers ! Leaflet of the Front de l'Indépendance. 1 p. 8vo. Instructions to follow for the Belgians assigned to accompany the German military trains as hostages. 215 x 135.

BL 0061

Officiers d'active et de réserve. Hauts fonctionnaires. Mandataires politiques. Magistrats, avocats, médecins, industriels. Leaflet of the Front de l'Indépendance. 2 pp. 8vo. Warnings against the arrests of numerous personalities. Probably at the beginning of 1944 according to the text. 215 x 135.

BL 0062

Londres. Terminus. Papillon pochoir (stencil)-coloured in purple and showing a casket with a swastika and Hitler's head. 50 x 75.

BL 0063

La clé de la Liberté showing a wrench pochoir(stencil)-coloured in red. On thin paper. 1 p. 8vo. 205 x 135.

BL 0064

[Funeral letter] Satirical funeral announcement on the death of Hitler and on the reverse of the death of Rex. 2 pp. 4to with black bordere. Bruxelles, G. Crockaert, n.d. [1945 ?]. Published during the celebrations of liberation at the same time as Hitler's last will and testament. 275 x 220.

BL 0065

Solidarité avec les victimes de la Gestapo. La vérité sur l'enfer de Breendonck. 4 pp. 16mo. Unknown printing process. On the living conditions of this "concentration" camp in which some Belgian patriots were executed. 140 x 110.

BL 0066

11 Novembre-Manifeste. Belges,... 1 p. small 4to. Leaflet from the Front de l'Indépendance. A call for unity of all Belgians for the November 11th celebrations of 1943. 215 x 185.

BL 0067

Belges, souvenez-vous des traitres ! 1 p. Square 12mo. Leaflet with photographs glued to paper and published by the underground newspaper *La Voix des Belges*. Text and photos concerning fascist collaborator Léon Degrelle. Filing holes. 140 x 150.

BL 0068

11 Juillet. Leaflet in French with and in Flemish on the reverse. 2 pp. 12mo. Commemorating the victory at the battle of the *Éperons d'Or* on July 11, 1302. A call for unity between the Flemish and the Walloons. 155 x 110.

BL 0069

À la Population Belge. À bas la Déportation. 2 pp. 8vo. Leaflet issued by the Centrale Wallonne du Parti Socialiste Belge. Protest against the four German ordinances of October 6 [1942 ?] ordering mass deportation of Belgians to Germany. This is probably similar to the S.T.O. in France. 215 x 125.

BL 0070

Appel du Front de l'Indépendance. Belges, Précipitez la débâcle d'Hitler ! 1 p. small 8vo. Leaflet of the Front de l'Indépendance. A call for unity and a call to arms following the attempt on Hitler's life on July 20, 1944. Cachet of private collections Joseph Depaepe and C. Piérard of Mons. 205 x 150.

BL 0071

Heures capitales / capitales heureuses. Sticker of the Front de l'Indépendance. On blue paper. Code G/22. 22 x 110.

BL 0072

Où sont les généraux allemands ? ... Sticker in French and Flemish of the Front de l'Indépendance. On blue paper. Code G/12. 48 x 127.

BL 0073

Belges. Aides les aviateurs alliés. ... Sticker of the Front de l'Indépendance. On blue paper. Code G/23 . 37 x 110.

BL 0074

Belges ! Les Boches reculent partout... Sticker of the Front de l'Indépendance. On blue paper. Code G/13. 42 x 127.

BL 0075

Kameraden !! Hört Die Signale. Mimeographed leaflet for German soldiers written by the Belgian Resistance. 2 pp. 4to. On the reverse, the text is partially erased. Yellowed. 275 x 215.

BL 0076

Osterreich wird frei und unabhangigsein. Mimeographie leaflet in German written by the Belgian Resistance and signed *Osterreichische Freiheitsfront. Gruppe Belgien*. 1 p. folio. The heading in French reads in translation: *This leaflet is aimed at German soldiers and workers. Circulate it*

amongst them by all possible means and with the necessary caution. See also leaflet BL 0077. 315 x 210.

BL 0077

Nicht Die Rote Armee - Hitler ist der Feind des Deutschen Volkes. Mimeographed leaflet in German written by the Belgian Resistance. 2 pp. 8vo oblong. The heading in French reads in translation: *This leaflet is aimed at German soldiers and workers. Circulate it amongst them by all possible means and with the necessary caution.* The text is incomplete as it was badly printed. A few lines are thus missing at the bottom of the first page and the top of the next page. See also leaflet BL 0076. 170 x 210.

BL 0078

Belges ! Le Pays compte sur vous. Leaflet of the Front de l'Indépendance. 1 p. 8vo. A general call to arms following the Normandy landing and the Allied advances. Probably printed in July-August 1944. Slightly worn. 210 x 150.

BL 0079

Contribution à l'Histoire de la Guerre. Anonymous leaflet-pamphlet 4 pp. 12mo. Violent diatribe against King Léopold III and the Flemish population accused of collaboration. Probably issued in the spring of 1941. According to the leaflet *Deuxième Contribution* (BL 0080), this leaflet was printed in an edition of 2000 copies. See also the pamphlet version (BL 0152). 170 x 130.

BL 0080

Deuxième Contribution à l'Histoire de la Guerre. Anonymous leaflet-pamphlet but by the same author(s) as BL 0079. 4 pp. 12mo. On reddish paper. A manuscript note states: *avant Juillet-September 1941.* 170 x 130.

BL 0081

Le Roi a constamment refusé d'exercer sa haute fonction.... (words from the quote on the heading). The text begins with *Le soir du mardi 6 June, à 23 heures...* 1 p. 8vo. Protest against the kidnapping of the King of Belgium by the Germans on June 6, 1944. The following manuscript inscription is at the top of the leaflet: *Message au peuple belge.* 245 x 160.

BL 0082

L'Amérique s'engage à terrasser l'axe (and also in Flemish). 4 pp. 12mo. Looks mimeographed in blue ink. Reprint by the Belgian Resistance of a leaflet airdropped on Belgium in February 1941 (code 212). French and Flemish text. Collection (?) stamp *Don Neufort*. A good example of dissemination of Allied propaganda by the Belgian Resistance. 215 x 140.

BL 0083

Ce que doit le monde à l'Allemagne. 2 pp. 4to. Carbon copy on onion skin. French translation by the Belgian Underground of an Allied leaflet (code 440-441) dropped over Germany from November 1940 to January 1941. Leaflets destined for Germany, especially those balloon-flown, often landed in other countries. 270 x 200.

BL 0084

De la Meuse jusqu'à Memel.... 1 p. 4to. Carbon copy on onion skin with manuscript notes and date. Copy of an Allied airdropped leaflet (a note identifies it as code 508 but it could also be code 448) over Germany probably during the spring of 1941. 270 x 200.

BL 0085

R.A.F. ..partout dans l'ouest occupé. 1 p. 4to Carbon copy on onion skin. Probably a copy of an airdropped leaflet (code 248 for Belgium and code 137 for France) destined to Belgium. The two leaflets mentioned were dropped during January 1942. 270 x 200.

BL 0086

Traduction d'un trac (sic) anglais libellé en allemand et trouvé sur le sol belge. The leaflet is titled *Que signifie la victoire de Roosevelt.* 1/2 p. small folio. Mimeographed in purple ink. Copy by the Belgian Resistance of a leaflet airdropped over Germany in November 1940 (code 447). 275 x 195.

BL 0087

Roosevelt accuse..... 2 pp. 8vo. Copy by the Belgian Resistance of an Allied leaflet dropped over Belgium (code 214) and France (code 60) from mid-January to the beginning of February 1941. At the end, one reads *Printed in England - S.C. Copiez et transmettez la présente.* Filing holes. 215 x 135.

BL 0088

Hitler ! Wohin Führst du Deutschland ? [Hitler! Where are you leading Germany?]. Leaflet of the Front de l'Indépendance du Borinage. 1 p. 4to. Linocut (?) showing an old-fashioned cab carrying Hitler with the caption *un fiacre allant culbutant* [from an old French song] 300 x 200.

BL 0089

Blitzkrieg oder.. blitztod ? The caption of an illustration showing a skeleton on a motorcycle. Probably of Belgian origin. 165 x 105.

BL 0090

Du bist nich allein – Du Kannst was tun ! Mimeographed leaflet in German for German troops. 3 pp. Probably of Belgian origin. 270 x 210.

BL 0091
