CHAPTER ONE



MAPS OF EASTERN CANADA & NEWFOUNDLAND

The early 18th century cartography of eastern Canada and the Maritimes was first defined by the map by Bellin, published in Histoire et Description Generale de la Nouvelle France ——, in Paris in 1744. He used this map as a basis for both his equivalent maps of 1745 and 1755. The 1744 map was also copied by Collyer ca. 1745, which in turn was copied by Jefferys for his map published in the Gentlemans Magazine, v.16, in 1746. Emanual Bowen also used the same Bellin cartography for his map of Canada and the eastern seaboard, first published in 1747 in A Complete System of Geography, and again in A Complete Atlas, or Distinct View of the Known World in 1752. Finally, Turner in Boston, New England, copied Jefferys version of Bellin's map, which then re-appeared in three further issues published in Philadelphia.

The 1745 edition of the Bellin map which is in the National Collection in Ottawa, has manuscript notations, and this particular copy may have accompanied the draft or working copy of the observations of the French commissioners relating to the English memorial of Shirley and Mildman (Jan 11, 1751). Certainly the cartography of the printed map which accompanied the Mémoires des Commissaires du Roi ---, in 1755 follows this format, as does the equivalent maps by both Jefferys, and Schreuder & Mortier, who both used the same titles. Numerous maps appeared subsequently illustrating the difficulty of interpretation of "the historical limits of Acadia".



An important map that Bellin used subsequently as a base for his later maps of the area, and one that was also copied extensively by numerous other cartographers, through to the middle of the century.



The details of the map distributers have been deleted from below the neat-line, and the only other change appears to be the name "R^e. S^t.Croix " which has been engraved parallel with the river. The map in the National Collection possibly accompanied the draft or working copy of the observations of the French commissioners relating to the English memorial of Shirley and Mildman (Jan 11, 1751). This map, and its title, also probably formed the basis for the printed map which accompanied the Mémoires des Commissaires du Roi — 1755. The information was then copied by Jefferys who also used the same title on his map included in "Remarks on the French Memorials, 1756". Le Rouge also copied the information for his own map "Partie Orientale du Canada" (ENTRY 741 p 56).

Numerous changes have been made to the plate, notably the left-hand corner, west and south of Lake Champlain, has been completely re-engraved, with changes to the Saint Lawrence River, Lake Ontario, Cape Cod, and with the addition of "*NOUVELLE YORK*". The two Fishing Banks at the right-hand edge of the map have been fully stippled and "Halifax" has been added. Notably "la Pointe Riche" is added towards the top of the west coast of Newfoundland, somewhat surprisingly for a French map (see the discussion on page 151, Vol II).








In the bottom centre, inside the neat-line, is engraved "*T. Jefferys sculp.*". The inset of the "Atlantic Ocean " from Collyer's previous map remains, but now with additional insets of "Quebec City " and "Fort Dauphin ", with " Plan of the City and Port of Louisbourg " replacing the block of text engraved top centre in Collyer's map. Numerous place names have also been added to Cape Breton and Nova Scotia. It is difficult to assess if this is a new engraved plate, or a second state of Collyer's map. Very close examination however, shows minute differences in the engraving over and above the obvious additions to the plate (see the two illustrations on page 46).





In addition to the change of title and to the imprint, numerous and extensive changes have been made to the map itself which now shows considerable detail of rivers, lakes, and mountains. The boundary between Nova Scotia and Sagadahoc is now defined from the mouth of the St. Croix River north to the St Lawrence River.






Plate 501. The second state of Chabert's chart of the Maritimes with a decorative cartouche added. Entry 700. (Courtesy of the National Archives of Canada).



There is also a final French quarto edition of 1757 with an additional [fourth] volume which contains a map showing the bounds of the 1620, 1662, 1665, 1732 charters [Virginia, Carolina, and Georgia], claimed by the English to run through to the Pacific (Winsor Vol. V, p. 482; BN du Q # 792, RES AD 39).








Plate 506. Map of the eastern seaboard published in A New and Complete History of the British Empire in America in 1755. Entry 706. (Courtesy of the Clements Library).



In addition to the change of title and the erasure of both the running title above the neat-line and the imprint below, there are numerous other major changes to the plate. For example, Anticosti Island, the Magdalen Islands, and Cape Breton have all been re-engraved with additional names added. Nova Scotia and the adjacent Fishing Banks have also been changed. The note below the cartouche has been changed to "— to the French / who by the last Treaty are / to Fish from Cape St John / to Cape Ray on the Coast / of Newfoundland".






Plate 513. The first state of Santini's map of Eastern Canada & Newfoundland published in 1776. Entry 713.






Plate 514. The first state of the Sayer & Bennett map published in The American Mi imprint below the border. Entry



