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### **SHORT GLOSSARY OF DANISH TOPOGRAPHICAL TERMS AND ABBREVIATIONS**

## INTRODUCTORY NOTE

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DANISH is a Scandinavian language derived mainly from Old Norse. Its later development was markedly affected by German. The modern tongue has lost much of the grammatical complication of Old Norse, but archaic features still survive in the dialects of Bornholm and North Jutland. There are two genders, common and neuter. Like the other Scandinavian tongues, Danish distinguishes indefinite from definite allusion to things, by using indefinite and definite forms of article and adjective. The definite article combines with unqualified nouns as a suffix. *E.g.*, from *By* (town) we get:

The following alphabet of twenty-eight letters is now used, in the order given :

a, aa, b, c, d, e, f, g, h, i, j, k, l, m, n, o, p, q, r, s, t, u, v, x, y, z, æ, ö (*or ø*).  
c, q, x, and z are used mainly in words of foreign origin. Ö and ø, originally different, are now hardly distinguished even by Danes. There is some official support for ö, but unofficially ø seems now to be preferred.

Aa is pronounced like *aw* in *law*: d after a vowel like *th* in *rather*; j like *y* in *yet*; v after a vowel like *oo* in *shoot*; y like *ee* in *feel* if said with rounded lips; æ like *e* in *bed* except at the end of a syllable when it is like *ai* in *air*; and ö (*or ø*) resembles *e* in *her* if said with slightly rounded lips. A marked feature of Danish pronunciation is the glottal stop (Stöd), a catch in the stream of sound, especially after an abrupt syllable. It is not represented in writing. The Danish alphabet is not used phonetically, and many a word is simpler to the ear than to the eye. Modern spelling is nevertheless somewhat adjusted to the spoken tongue. A word now pronounced "far" is no longer written "fader."

This glossary was collected from Danish maps, including those of Greenland and Iceland. The following explanatory abbreviations and contractions appear in it.
