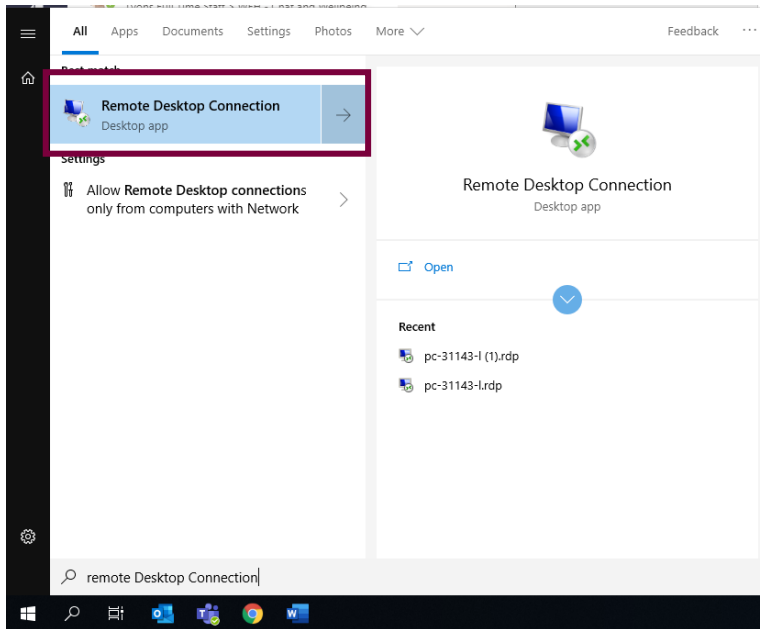


Remote Computer Access:

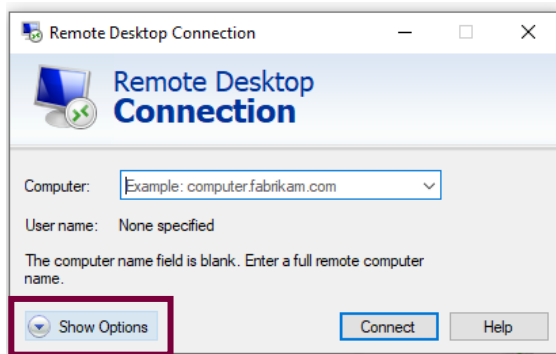
How to connect your microphone, camera, and local files.

Note: make sure you have loaded the McMaster VPN (Virtual Private Network).

Open Remote Desktop Connection



Click on Show Options

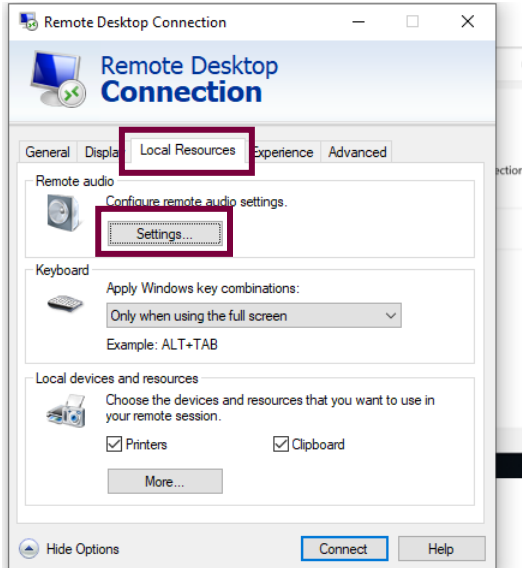

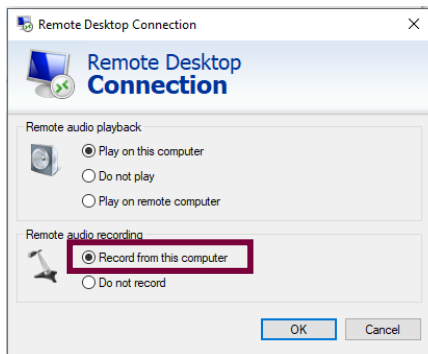

Microphone Settings

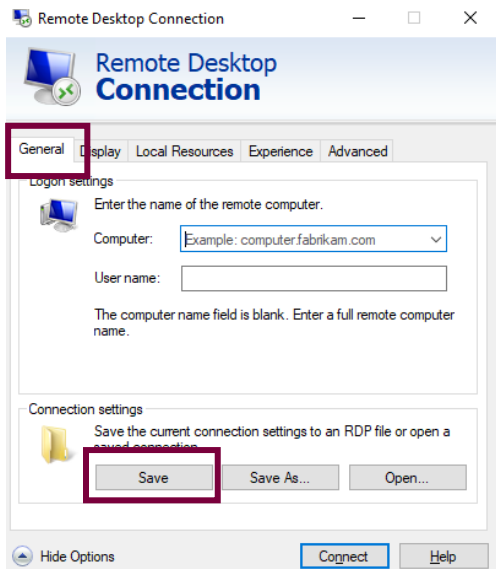
Under the **Local Resources** tab, in the **Remote Audio** section, click on **settings**.



In the remote audio recording section, select **record from this computer**. Click on **OK**.



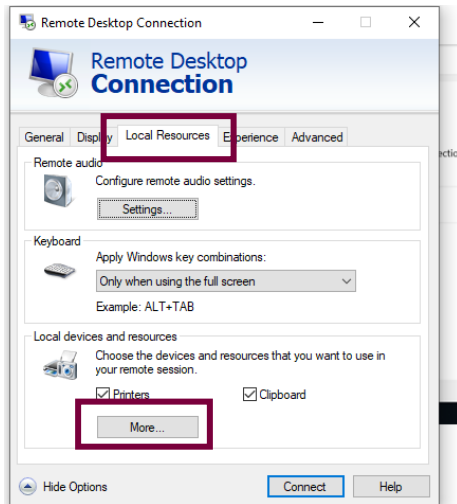
Under the **General** tab, in the **Connection settings** section, click on **Save**.



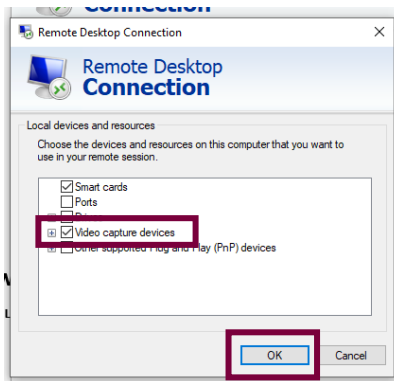
Camera Settings

Note: This is a remote connection, so direct recording in fairly to very high resolution may cause performance issues and will be affected greatly by the speed of your internet connection. It is recommended to record at home using free tools, then upload to edit.

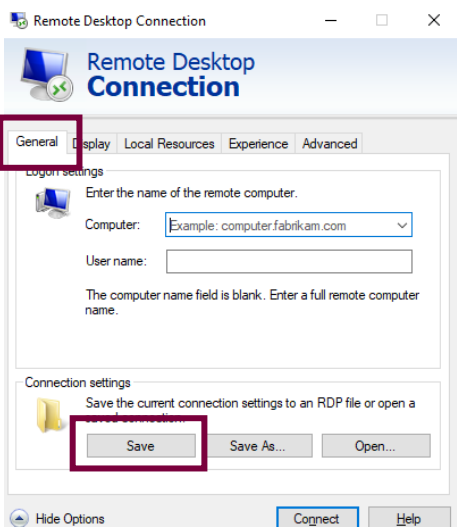
Under the **Local Resources** tab, in the **Local devices and resources** section, click on **more**.



Select video capture devices and click on **OK**.



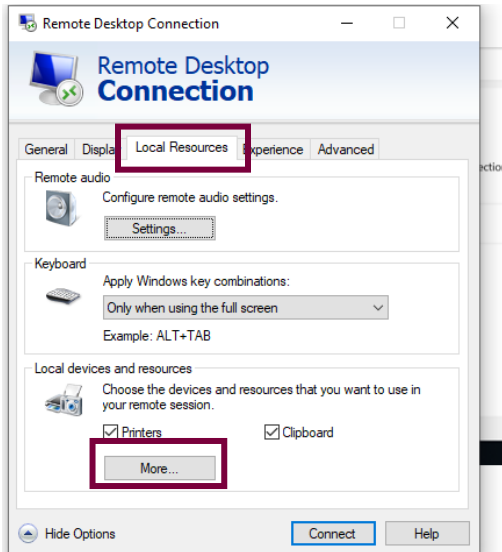
Under the **General** tab, in the **Connection settings** section, click on **Save**.



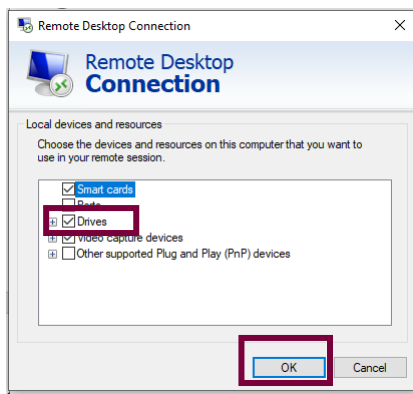
Local Files

Note: For best performance, it is recommended to copy files from your local drive onto the remotely accessed computer, once connected.

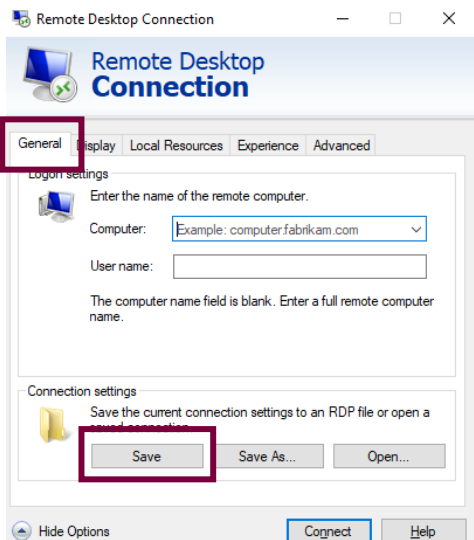
Under the **Local Resources** tab, in the **Local devices and resources** section, click on **more**.



Select **Drives** and click on **OK**.



Under the **General** tab, in the **Connection settings** section, click on **Save**.
